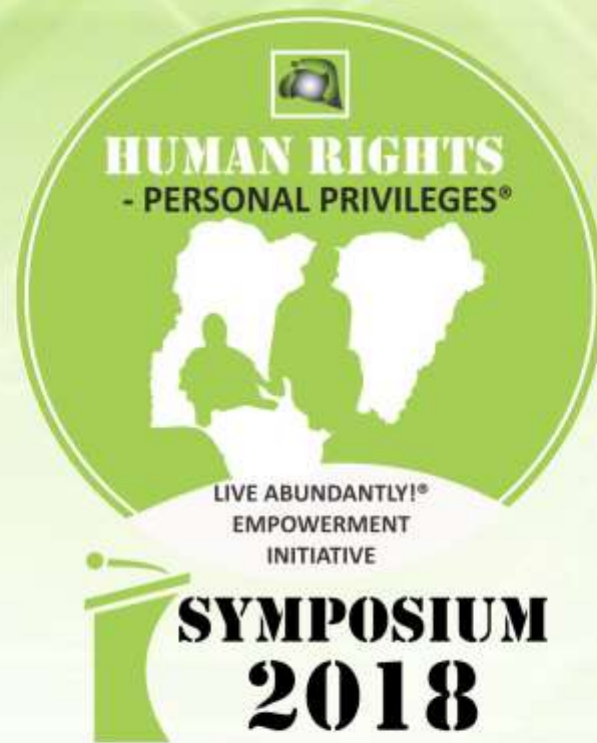

The nation's tertiary institution has come a long way. Since the establishment of Yaba Higher College, there has been a phenomenal growth in the sector, which now include private institutions.

According to stakeholders, these growth and development have not been without challenges, some of which have been caused by the rapid physical expansion in its some cases by social, political and economic factors.

Certainly, this is not the best of time for the nation's tertiary institutions. Aside the incessant strikes by staff unions, non-conviction of adequate funds to pay salaries as at when due and lack of teaching facilities, the system is currently embroiled in scandal involving some lecturers and their female students.

In the last two months, two of the nation's top universities, Obafemi Awolowo University (OAU), Ile-Ife and University of Lagos, Akoka have been rocked by allegations of sex-for-marks. The accused lecturers are high ranking academic staff.

A former postgraduate student of OAU, Miss Melissa Onyiah-Ogboke (she/her) revealed an audio recording of her conversation with Prof. Hilaria Akintola in the Department of Management Accounting denouncing for five students of sex in exchange for marks.

The Vice-Chancellor of OAU, Prof. Eyoike Ojo, however, set up a panel and based on its recommendation approved the suspension of

"Girls should advocate for their rights. They should speak up when they see an inappropriate or really inappropriate. Adults should connect girls with special skills in life."

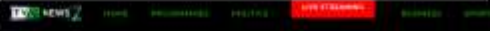

'NAPTIP convicted 359 human traffickers in 15 years, rescued 3,500 from Libya



The National Agency for the Prohibition of Trafficking in Persons (NAPTIP) recently said it had presented and received 359 persons for human trafficking offences and rescued over 3,500 Nigerians from Libya in its 15 years of existence.

Director General of the agency, Doreen Aducci Clark Drexel, who delivered this in Abuja during a press conference to mark the 15 years anniversary of the agency, said the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) had also rescued 2,000 persons from Libya.

She noted that although they have made thousands of arrests in the last 15 years, but a lot of prosecution and investigation are currently ongoing.
